



Learning climate

A safe learning climate is essential for a student. By being involved, making clear expectations and exploring together, you support the learning process and make learning feel natural.



A good learning climate starts with listening, guiding, and giving space to explore.



A positive learning climate helps students gain confidence, dare to ask questions and develop new skills. It's not only about transferring knowledge but also about providing the right support, feedback and space to experiment. This way, learning and development become part of daily practice.

What works

- Set clear expectations and plan tasks logically around the student's learning goals.
- Explore together: ask questions and collaborate on solutions.
- Show curiosity and encourage experimenting.
- Give space to make mistakes and learn together.
- Actively ask what you should take into account during the entire work placement period.

What doesn't work

- Assuming the student knows who to ask questions to.
- Having little or no communication with the student.
- Assuming that 'simple tasks' require no guidance.
- Judging the student's ideas or opinions.
- Expecting the student to understand everything immediately or ask questions on their own.
